With 100% high school graduation rate the past two years and 100% school attendance by all school-age children during the past four years, the program is demonstrating impressive results. Education Specialist Darrell Finch of the Community Services Division coordinates the effort, which includes quarterly educational goal-setting meetings with over 120 families, an after-school

HACM youth tour the UW-Madison campus

On Saturday, October 10th, HACM's Education Initiative facilitated a tour of UW-Madison for nineteen high school and middle school students from Highland Park Homes, Scattered Sites, Townhomes at Carver Park and Westlawn. The students were accompanied by Education Specialist Darrell Finch and three parents. With the cool winds blowing and the first sign of snow in the air, the group toured

the nine-hundred-acre campus and met with representatives working in the fields of Architecture, Business, Law, Art, Music, Nursing, and Engineering. Campus representatives shared information on college life, scholarships opportunities, ACT/SAT scores, academic support services, and enrollment. After the tour, students enjoyed lunch on campus, talked about their college goals, and reflected on their first college tour. Through the HACM Education Initiative College Bound Program, all twelfth graders are being acclimated and exposed to an academic surrounding that will enhance and assist them in life skills, career planning and college preparation. Currently 60% of the June 2009 high school graduates are enrolled in college.



Ninth annual spelling bee was un-bee-lievable!

The pressure was tense and youth were highly focused during HACM's Ninth Annual Spelling Bee held October 29th at the Community Services building on Reservoir Street. Family members watched as 6th, 7th and 8th grade youth from Westlawn, Northlawn, Highland Homes, Townhomes at Carver, Hillside, and Scattered Sites competed for cash prizes and trophies. The Pieper- Hillside Boys & Girls Club and Silver

Spring Neighborhood Center partnered with HACM to prepare youth for the event. Milwaukee Journal Sentinel columnist Eugene Kane served as the pronouncer, and HACM Housing Operations Manager Beverly Johnson, Assistant City Attorney John Heinen, Orthopedic Surgeon Dr. Jeffery Butler, and WITI-TV 6 Anchor and Reporter Bob Moore served as judges. The top three winners in each age group received cash prizes and trophies. All participants received t-shirts and certificates and were treated to refreshments after the event. Education Specialist Darrell Finch, who served as the moderator, stated "Spelling bees build self-esteem and confidence in our youth and lay a foundation for academic excellence." First place winners in each age group were: Khadimou Fall - Scattered Sites (6th grade); Angel Parker - Westlawn (7th grade); and Cherish Hayes - Hillside (8th grade). Education Initiative's "Power Readers" Attend Play

On Saturday, December 5th, the "Power Readers," a group of students from the Highland Homes and Scattered Sites Homes Book of the Month Club, attended the First Stage Children's Theater production of Barbara Robinson's "*The Best Christmas Pageant Ever*." The comedy centers on a group of young misfits who hilariously take over the lead roles in their town's Christmas play and end up teaching their neighbors lessons about the meaning of Christmas. Great acting, creative choreography, and sing-along Christmas carols with the

audience made for a pleasurable and impressionable evening for the students. It was the first time some of the youth had attended a play. The Power Readers meet once a week to have refreshments and discuss the merits of the books they read. They also attend cultural activities together to help improve social interaction. Education Specialist Darrell Finch states, "In an effort to promote the value of reading in a fun and enjoyable way, students are encouraged as a group to pick a book to read for a month and then attend the movie or production of the book."

BURNING DESIRE

In my interventions with your children as the Education Specialist, I encourage independent thinking. My approach has been to alter negative behavior and channel it into positive, life-long reinforcements, thereby promoting a "Burning Desire" to achieve their dreams. A burning desire sets attitude and standards that lays a foundation to achieve goals. It also gives structure such as being in school every day and developing good habits and study skills that are needed to obtain a quality education. My intervention has consisted of asking them, "Who are you" and "What do you want to accomplish in life". We then implement these components: Burning Desire + Goal + Plan + Realistic Objectives + Action = Success. Achieving the goal is important, but our emphasis is placed on the preparation of reaching the goal. Students always tell me of their hope or wish to attend college. I enforce that hopes and wishes are a state of being that is only propelled when you apply action to the plan. A "Burning Desire" infuses a high level of expectation for our children and obliterates negative illusions.
